Message from the President

An outbreak of viral pneumonia happened at the end of 2019 in the central city of Wuhan of Hubei Province in Mainland China. The pneumonia is described as "Severe Respiratory Disease associated with a Novel Infectious Agent". A novel coronavirus, a new strain of coronavirus that has not been previously identified in humans, was found to be the causative agent. World Health Organisation (WHO) recommended the interim name of the disease to be "2019-nCoV acute respiratory disease" where 'n' is for novel and 'CoV' is for coronavirus. The new coronavirus has recent been named COVID-19, with the 'CO' for corona, the 'VI' for virus and the 'D' for disease. The outbreak of the disease constitutes a public health emergency of international concern. The Government has decided to raise the response level of the "Preparedness and Response Plan for Novel Infectious Disease of Public Health Significance" to the Emergency Level on 25 January 2020. Globally, the number of confirmed cases is on a rapidly rising trend at the time of writing.

The outbreak of COVID-19 inevitably reminded us of the previous Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) outbreak in 2003. In order to reduce the general risk of transmission, it is very important to remind everyone to maintain good personal and environmental hygiene.

As in every major outbreak of novel disease, the initial information about the disease could be very limited. Quite often, the news related to the novel disease could be quite conflicting and may not be easy to follow. With the team efforts of our College's Executives and Council members, with effect from 29 January 2020, we have introduced in our own College website the links to local and international websites

providing regular update on COVID-19 for ease of reference, special thanks to the coordination and efficient work of Dr. Lau Ho Lim and Ms. Erica So. Several of our Council members also appeared in various media to share about the combat against COVID-19 infection and related issues, including



Dr. Billy Chiu, Dr. Allan Ngan, Dr. Ken Ho, Dr. Lau Ho Lim, Dr. Angus Chan and myself, just to name a few. We have also been actively exploring the alternative means of conducting our CME/CPD activities during the outbreak by using various videoconferencing modalities, thanks to our Web Committee lead by Dr. Matthew Luk. With the concerted effort by Dr. Alvin Chan and the Board of Education, we would be ready to try it out in the coming couple of weeks. Professor Samuel Wong and the Research Committee launched an online survey on the doctors' response to the COVID-19 outbreak in Hong Kong. Thank you all for helping to respond to the survey.

Dr. Donald Li, our WONCA President, has also reiterated the important role of family doctors and primary healthcare in Disaster / Emergency preparedness and response in relation to the novel coronavirus outbreak. (https://www.globalfamilydoctor.com/News/DonaldLiontheCoronavirus.aspx) In his message, Dr. Li said, "Family doctors have the "first in, last out" role. They always stand in the forefront, as well they are also the ones who manage the aftermath of contingencies. Outbreaks would bring long-lasting

Kindly note that each application will be handled independently upon receipt of the application. Submission of additional information for the application, if any, will incur new charges.

THIRTY-FOURTH CONJOINT HKCFP/RACGP FELLOWSHIP EXAMINATION SECOND Announcement

The Board of Conjoint Examination is pleased to announce the following information on the Thirty-fourth Conjoint Fellowship Examination with the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners to be held in 2020.

(1) REQUIREMENTS AND ELIGIBILITY

All candidates **MUST** be FULL OR ASSOCIATE members of BOTH HKCFP AND RACGP* at the time of application for the Examination and at the time of the Conjoint Examination.

(*Documentary evidence is required with the application – including a valid RACGP number.)

(**Note** : All candidates are required to renew their RACGP membership for the year 2020/2021 before 31 July 2020. Failure to comply with the rule may result in denial of admission to the Exam.)

In addition, they must be EITHER CATEGORY I OR CATEGORY II CANDIDATES: -

(a) **CATEGORY I CANDIDATES** are graduate doctors (FULLY OR LIMITED registered with the Hong Kong Medical Council) who are undergoing or have completed a fully approved vocational training programme as outlined in the College's Handbook for Vocational Training in Family Medicine.

After satisfactory completion of two years of approved training, Category I candidates or trainees may apply to sit the Written Examination, both the two segments of which must be taken at the same attempt. After satisfactory completion of four years of supervised training, Category I candidates may apply to sit the Clinical Examination.

(**Note:** For Category I candidates who have enrolled in the vocational training programme before 31 December 2018, and who apply for the award of RACGP Fellowship before 1 March 2027, they will remain entitled to be awarded FRACGP. All other candidates are eligible to apply for the award of International Conjoint RACGP Fellowship (ICFRACGP).

All Category I candidates who are current vocational trainees and apply to sit the Written Examination <u>MUST</u> submit evidence of completion of at least 15 months of approved training by 31 March 2020, together with the application. Those current vocational trainees who apply for the Clinical Examination <u>MUST</u> submit evidence of completion of at least 39 months of approved training by 31 March 2020, together with the application. Candidates who have already completed vocational training <u>MUST</u> submit evidence of completion of vocational training, together with the application.

Part-time trainees must submit evidence of completion of their vocational training by the time of the Written Examination before they can apply to sit the examination.)

(b) **CATEGORY II CANDIDATES** are doctors who are FULLY registered with the Hong Kong Medical Council and have been predominantly in general practice in Hong Kong for not less than **five** years by 30 June 2020.

Category II candidates may opt to only sit for the Written Examination at the first and subsequent application. Enquiries about eligibility to sit the examination should be directed to the Chairman of the Board of Conjoint Examination.

The eligibility of candidates of both categories is subject to the final approval of the Board of Conjoint Examination, HKCFP.

Application will not be processed unless all the documents are submitted with the application form.

(2) FORMAT AND CONTENTS

A. Written Examination

Applied Knowledge Test (AKT)*, and

Key Feature Problems (KFP)

*Note: Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ) has been renamed as Applied Knowledge Test (AKT) from Conjoint Exam 2018, with no major change on the exam format.

B. Clinical Examination

Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE)

(3) PRE-REQUISITE FOR CLINICAL SEGMENTS

All candidates applying to sit for the Clinical Examination of the Conjoint Fellowship Examination MUST possess a APCLS (Advanced Primary Care Life Support) certificate issued by the HKCFP*. The validity of this certificate must cover the time of the Clinical Examination.

Application will not be processed unless the pre-requisite is fulfilled.

*Note: In regarding the APCLS certificate as issued by the HKCFP, the dates of APCLS workshops & examinations for 2020 will be confirmed shortly. Please register with our College secretariat at 2871 8899 IMMEDIATELY if you do not hold a valid APCLS certificate issued by HKCFP and intend to sit for the Conjoint Examination 2020.

(4) CRITERIA FOR A PASS IN THE EXAMINATION

A candidate will be required to pass the entire Written Examination in one sitting. That is, if one fails the Written Examination, both the AKT and KFP segments have to be re-taken. Successful Written Examination result can be retained for three years (until the Clinical Examination of 2023).

The Clinical Examination can only be taken after successful attempt of the Written Examination. If one fails the Clinical Examination, all the OSCE stations have to be re-taken.

A candidate has to pass both the Written and the Clinical Examinations in order to pass the Conjoint HKCFP/RACGP Fellowship Examination.

(5) APPLICATION AND EXAMINATION FEES

Application forms are available from the College Secretariat at Room 803-4, HKAM Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Aberdeen, Hong Kong. You may also download the application forms from our College website, http://www.hkcfp.org.hk. Please note that the deadline for application is **8 April 2020 (Wednesday)**.

(6) REFUND POLICY

Examination Fee:

If a candidate wishes to withdraw from the examination, and written notice of withdrawal is received by the College 60 days or more prior to the date of the examination, he / she will receive a refund of \$31,000 (for the whole examination), \$15,500 (for the written examination) or \$15,500 (for the clinical examination). The application fee of \$3,000 will not be refunded.

No refund will be given if the written notice of withdrawal is received by the College within 60 days of the date of the examination.

All fees paid are not transferable to subsequent examinations.

Coronavirus

Coronaviruses (CoV) are named for the crown-like spikes on their surface. There are four main sub-groupings of coronaviruses, known as alpha, beta, gamma, and delta. They are a large family of viruses that cause illness ranging from common cold to more severe diseases such as Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS-CoV) and Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS-CoV). A novel coronavirus (COVID-19) is a new strain that has not been previously identified in humans.

Coronaviruses are zoonotic, meaning they are transmitted between animals and humans. Detailed investigations found that SARS-CoV was transmitted from civet cats to humans and MERS-CoV from dromedary camels to humans. Several known coronaviruses are circulating in animals that have not yet infected humans.

Human coronaviruses were first identified in the mid-1960s. The seven coronaviruses that can infect people are:

- Common human coronaviruses
 - o 229E (alpha coronavirus)
 - NL63 (alpha coronavirus)
 - o OC43 (beta coronavirus)
 - HKU1 (beta coronavirus)
- Other human coronaviruses
 - MERS-CoV (the beta coronavirus that causes Middle East Respiratory Syndrome, or MERS)
 - SARS-CoV (the beta coronavirus that causes severe acute respiratory syndrome, or SARS)
 - o 2019 Novel Coronavirus COVID-19

People around the world commonly get infected with human coronaviruses 229E, NL63, OC43, and HKU1.

Sometimes coronaviruses that infect animals can evolve and make people sick and become a new human coronavirus. Three recent examples of this are COVID-19, SARS-CoV, and MERS-CoV.

"Severe Respiratory Disease associated with a Novel Infectious Agent" refers to the cluster of viral pneumonia cases occurring in Wuhan, Hubei Province, since December 2019. According to investigation by the Mainland health authorities, a novel coronavirus (COVID-19) is found to be the causative agent.

Common signs of infection include respiratory symptoms, fever, cough, shortness of breath and breathing difficulties. In more severe cases, infection can cause pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure and even death.

The main mode of transmission of novel coronavirus is through respiratory droplets, the virus can also be transmitted through contact. Current information suggests that the incubation period ranges from 1 to 12.5 days (with median estimates of 5 to 6 days), but can be as long as 14 days.

Health advice

Members of the public should always maintain good personal and environmental hygiene. They are advised to:

- Perform hand hygiene before touching the mouth, nose or eyes; after touching public installations such as handrails or door knobs; or when hands are contaminated by respiratory secretions after coughing or sneezing;
- Cover your mouth and nose with tissue paper when sneezing or coughing. Dispose of soiled tissues into a lidded rubbish bin, then wash hands thoroughly; and
- When having respiratory symptoms, wear a surgical mask, refrain from work or attending class at school, avoid going to crowded places and seek medical advice promptly.

Travel advice

The public should take heed of the health advice below when travelling outside Hong Kong:

- Avoid close contact with persons with fever or respiratory symptoms in countries/areas with possible transmission of novel coronavirus infection. If it is unavoidable to come into contact with them, put on a surgical mask and continue to do so until 14 days after returning to Hong Kong;
- Avoid visiting wet markets, live poultry markets or farms:
- If feeling unwell when outside Hong Kong, especially
 if having a fever or cough, wear a surgical mask,
 inform the hotel staff or tour escort and seek medical
 advice at once; and
- After returning to Hong Kong, consult a doctor promptly if having a fever or other symptoms, take the initiative to inform the doctor of any recent travel history and any exposure to animals, and wear a surgical mask to help prevent spread of the disease.



As required by the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP), CPR training course needs to have advanced component on airway management, neck support and automated external defibrillation (AED) on top of basic life support. In order to align with our Sister College (RACGP) and in achievement of reciprocal recognition in Conjoint Fellowship Examination and Quality Assurance Certificate, the CPR Subcommittee of the Board of Education is pleased to announce that an enhanced CPR course, the Advanced Primary Care Life Support (APCLS) had been launched in 2017.

APCLS course materials have been endorsed by HKCFP Council in 2015 and the Resuscitation Council of Hong Kong (RCHK) in 2016.
