PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE (DR. JOHN T. N. CHUNG)

This year may prove to be a watershed, or the making of one, in the history of the College. I shall write more on that later on.

The year began with a spring visit by a College delegation to Beijing to participate in a four-party (China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Macau) conference in family medicine. The China connection continued with a series of visits in the summer by the Guangzhou Medical College to family medicine training facilities here arranged by the College. Furthermore, the College is poised to take part in co-ordinating activities under the auspices of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine with the view to assist the Chinese Ministry of Health in founding a body embracing all medical specialties, one similar to our Academy. We are pleased to have the opportunity to exert our influence to help establish family medicine as a specialty in the mainland.

Council has determined that an alternative training pathway is in demand for College members who have not undergone a formal vocational training programme and wish to become specialists in family medicine. Furthermore, such a programme would also offer an option to members of other colleges who for various reasons intend to practise family medicine. The Board of Vocational Training and Standards will take up the task of detailing the programme and Council will pursue this matter in the next year.

Preparations for celebrating our 30th birthday next year have started in earnest with work on a book chronicling our history. Next year's Annual Scientific Meeting will be a highlight in the calendar of events rounding off with a huge celebratory gathering planned for next winter. We should be proud of our heritage and I pay tribute to our past presidents for guiding the College to its present strong position.

In the year the College has convened a special group to make proposals to the government on setting up a Primary Care Doctors Registry. We are committed to uphold standards in family medicine and pleased that we have had the opportunity to make known our views on developing primary medical care in Hong Kong.

As I write, the College is under challenge from unexpected quarters on the way we conduct specialist examinations and uphold standards. By that I mean the controversy on the legitimacy of a computer generated Dangerous Drugs Registry. Council takes this challenge very seriously and has sought legal advice and opinion from experts in information technology. The issues affect all practising doctors in Hong Kong. We have strong evidence to support our position and the least I hope which comes out of this debate is an awareness that the practice of medicine has changed with the progress of time and may be now is the occasion to review our perception of best medical practice. This is what I mean by the watershed in our history.

In October I had the pleasure of attending the Annual Scientific Convention of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners where I and other delegates from the College established contacts with the new president and other officials of the Royal Australian College. We will maintain our relationship with our partners in quality family medical care and continue to refine our conjoint fellowship examination.

In this Annual Report you will read about the work of the various boards and committees and I hope you will derive satisfaction from the knowledge that the College has always striven to promote family medicine and worked for your interests. My thanks are due to the Secretariat, ably led by Miss Jessica Cheng, for their usual devotion and steadfastness. The staff form really the backbone of what we do, for without them, nothing gets done!

I have come to the end of my office. It has been a very busy and challenging time but an immense pleasure to work for the College. I thank my Council for their co-operation, understanding and patience and hope you will give the new president and council the same support.

HONORARY SECRETARY'S MESSAGE (DR. CHAN HUNG CHIU)

Under the leadership of our College President, Dr. John Chung, HKCFP continues to work hard on the promotion of quality family medicine locally and internationally, as well as on the setting and maintaining standards for education, researches and quality primary care in Hong Kong.

Internationally, we have involved in a number of events. In April 2006, our President, Dr. John Chung and our College delegates, had attended the Four Parties Conference on Family Medicine organized by the General Practice Training Centre of the Ministry of Health, General Practice Society of the Chinese Teachers' Association and HKCFP, and hosted by the School of Public Health and College of Family Medicine of the Capital University of Medical Sciences of Beijing. Plenary presentations were delivered by Drs. John Chung, Cindy Lam, Daniel Chu and Chan Kwok Wai.

In June, upon request of the Department of Health of Macau, the Board of Diploma in Family Medicine organized a Consultation Skills Workshop at the Department of Health centre in Macau which was attended by forty doctors in Macau.

Though the 3rd FM Refresher Course planned to be held in Shenzhen was cancelled, our College had received about 200 visitors (doctors and related persons) from Guangzhou in September. Seminars were conducted and visits to public and private FM practices were arranged.

In October, college delegates led by Dr. Chung attended the 49th Annual Scientific Convention and Annual General Meeting of RACGP in Brisbane. Delegates had also attended the National Standing Committees (NSC)-Education meeting of RACGP.

In November this year, college delegates attended the WONCA Asia Pacific Regional Conference in Bangkok.

As you have already known, HKCFP will be hosting the 2009 WONCA Regional Conference. Our Host Organizing Committee has already been working steadily for this great event. The theme of the conference is "Building Bridges". Conference secretary has now been selected. You will be seeing more and more promotional activities on their way in the coming year. The College is looking forward to your full support and participation.

In September 2005, Dr. Donald Li, our Immediate Past President, received his Honorary Fellowship of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners. We are delighted and honoured to have another distinguished fellow of our college to obtain an international recognition for his contribution to the development of family medicine.

Locally, college activities on training, standards, education and research remain as active as ever.

Measures to improve regulation compliance had been re-enforced by the Board of Vocational Training and Standards (BVTs) with the aim to better monitor our existing vocational training program. There are now increasing numbers of new higher trainees following their success in the college Conjoint Examination. As the train-the-trainers course conducted by Prof. Robin Fraser, was completed in March this year, you can expect some new training courses coming up in the near future for our local trainers.

The Continuous Professional Development (CPD) and Quality Assurance (QA) programmes of the College have gained well acceptance. As our Practice Assessment Package (PAP) was first introduced in 1986, the QA & A committee is going to rewrite the document with incorporation of new topics including infectious disease control and risk management.

The transition into an entire new format Conjoint HKCFP/RACGP Examination was completed in 2005. We would like to welcome the 33 fresh College Fellows (successful candidates of the Conjoint HKCFP/RACGP Exam) this year, and the 9 successful higher trainees who had passed the college Exit Examination and were nominated as Fellows of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (FHKAM) in Family Medicine.

Our diversified educational programmes and the Diploma in Family Medicine (DFM) course continue to receive its popularity as demonstrated by its constantly large number of participants every year. This year, there were altogether 51 doctors to obtain the Diploma in Family Medicine, DFM (HKCFP).

The Public Education Committee has just had an exceptionally busy year. Regular activities including talks in local radios and television broadcasting programmes, and, article publications in various local newspaper and magazines, have gained their popularity in our local community.

To promote research activities among local family physicians is one of the major tasks of HKCFP. In addition to present our Annual Research Award to the winning researchers, the HKCFP has also granted our 2006 HKCFP Research Fellowship in May this year. As the number of applications is increasing, we will probably give out more than one research fellowship next year to further encourage local researches on Family Medicine.

In response to the need of advising on professional performance to medical doctors who might require peer review, supervision or audit, a new committee, the Professional Performance Committee (PPC), chaired by Dr. Andrew Ip, is established by the college this year. Under the instruction of the Hong Kong Medical Council, there was one doctor seeking advice from the PPC this year.

Despite the consultative document "Building a Healthy Tomorrow" was published for over 1 year, we are still waiting to hear the financial planning of this ambitious medical reform by the Secretary of Health, Welfare and Food Bureau. However, in response to this document, the college commissioned the Social Sciences Research Centre of the University of Hong Kong to conduct a telephone survey on public expectations of primary healthcare services in Hong Kong. It is hoped that the various findings can be of use for future planning by the Bureau. I am sure you will find the findings of this survey informative.

The college membership continues to grow steadily and the current number is almost 1700. The College financial status remains sound and healthy.

I have just highlighted some of the major events of the HKCFP in the past year. Readers could refer to the detailed reports from various boards and committees in this Annual Report 2005-2006.

I would like to sincerely thank the Secretariat and Ms. Jessica Cheng, our Executive Manager, for their hard work throughout the year.

Chairman's Message

The DFM course entered her fourth year in 2006. Forty-two doctors were enrolled this year. Although the number of students had dropped (this drop also occurred in similar diplomas), there was a significant increase in the proportion of private practitioners attending the course as compared to those of previous year. This reflected a greater awareness among doctors in the private sector of the importance of knowledge and skills of family medicine in their medical practice. This positive trend was encouraging and the Board hoped more private practitioners would enhance their knowledge in family medicine, so that a better and more efficient primary care could be delivered to the community.

The Department of Health of Macau approached Dr. Wun Yuk Tsan in early May of this year for the demonstration of some workshops of the DFM to doctors in Macau. The Board organized a Consultation Skills workshop at this first invitation on 24 June 2006. The experience was rewarding to both parties. The College also took the opportunity to exchange views and experience in family medicine training with the medical representatives of Macau. They include Drs. Cheang Seng Ip (Sub-Director of Department of Health Macau), Pang Heng Va (Coordinator of Primary Health Care), Chau Chi Hong (Coordinator of Committee of Internship Doctors), Fong Hou Meng (President of Macau General Practitioners Association), Lo Chio Kam (President of Macau Chinese Medical Association), Chan Iek Lap (Honorary President of Macau Chinese Medical Association), Cheong Lai Ma (President of Macau Private Doctors Association) and Lio Oi Ieng (Vice-President of Macau Private Doctors Association). The Board was grateful for their invitation and hospitality. I also wished to thank Drs. Chairman's Message

The Board has persevered in our efforts to monitor and ameliorate the standards of our vocational training programme. Emphasis has been made to stress the importance of compliance to the various rules and regulations. Return of the Annual Checklists by trainees is one area which has shown dramatic improvement. Regular accreditation and re-accreditation activities are carried out by our members to ensure the standard and quality of the training practices. Our structured educational programme would need prior submission for pre-approval code issued by the Board which is very important to ensure the programme would meet the requirements of the different modules.

New enrolments of Basic and Higher training for the year are 71 and 30 respectively. The number of new Basic trainees will fluctuate, depending mainly on the availability of training posts from Hospital Authority. The number of new Higher trainees shows a steady increase with more new Cat.I Fellows passed the Conjoint examination after completion of 4 years Basic vocational Training.

The train-the-trainers courses organised by Prof. Robin Fraser has been completed in March this year with great success. The 3 courses each consisted of 8 sessions and each session lasted at least 6 hours aiming at standardising training methods based on the LAP developed by Prof. Fraser. All participants passed the final assessment and were awarded the Certificate for Teachers in Family Medicine. The next stage would aim at organising training courses by these core members of our new Trainer subcommittee.

Output

Congratulations to our trainees for passing the HKCFP/RACGP Conjoint Examination in 2005 and for being elected Fellows of the Hong Kong College of Family Physicians and the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE (AM AFFAIRS)

The Education Committee is one of the statutory committees under the HKAM. It supervises and overlooks the CME/CPD activities of all the Academic Colleges. There are a few highlights, which I wish to bring to the members' attention.

1. The objective of CME/CPD is to keep Fellows informed and up-to-date, and to maintain a high standard of professional practice.
2. CME/CPD programmes established by the Colleges must be clearly defined and approved by the Education Committee of the Academy. Colleges shall make efforts to facilitate and to accommodate the participation from all Fellows.
3. Colleges shall report to the Education Committee of the Academy any Fellow of the Academy who fails to comply with CME/CPD requirements at the end of the cycle. The Education Committee of the Academy shall then consider sanction.
4. HKAM established a Training Scholarship to assist young doctors or fellows from Mainland to receive training in Hong Kong and our counterpart to have training in Mainland.
5. The Education Committee agreed that Colleges could decide to accept an annual summary CME/CPD report, on point to point basis, of an overseas College submitted by a Fellow provided they were satisfied that the CME/CPD programme of this overseas College is comparable to theirs.
6. HKAM intended to mandate the fellows to participate in active CME/CPD activities starting from the CME/CPD cycle from 2011. Details will be put forward to discussion later.

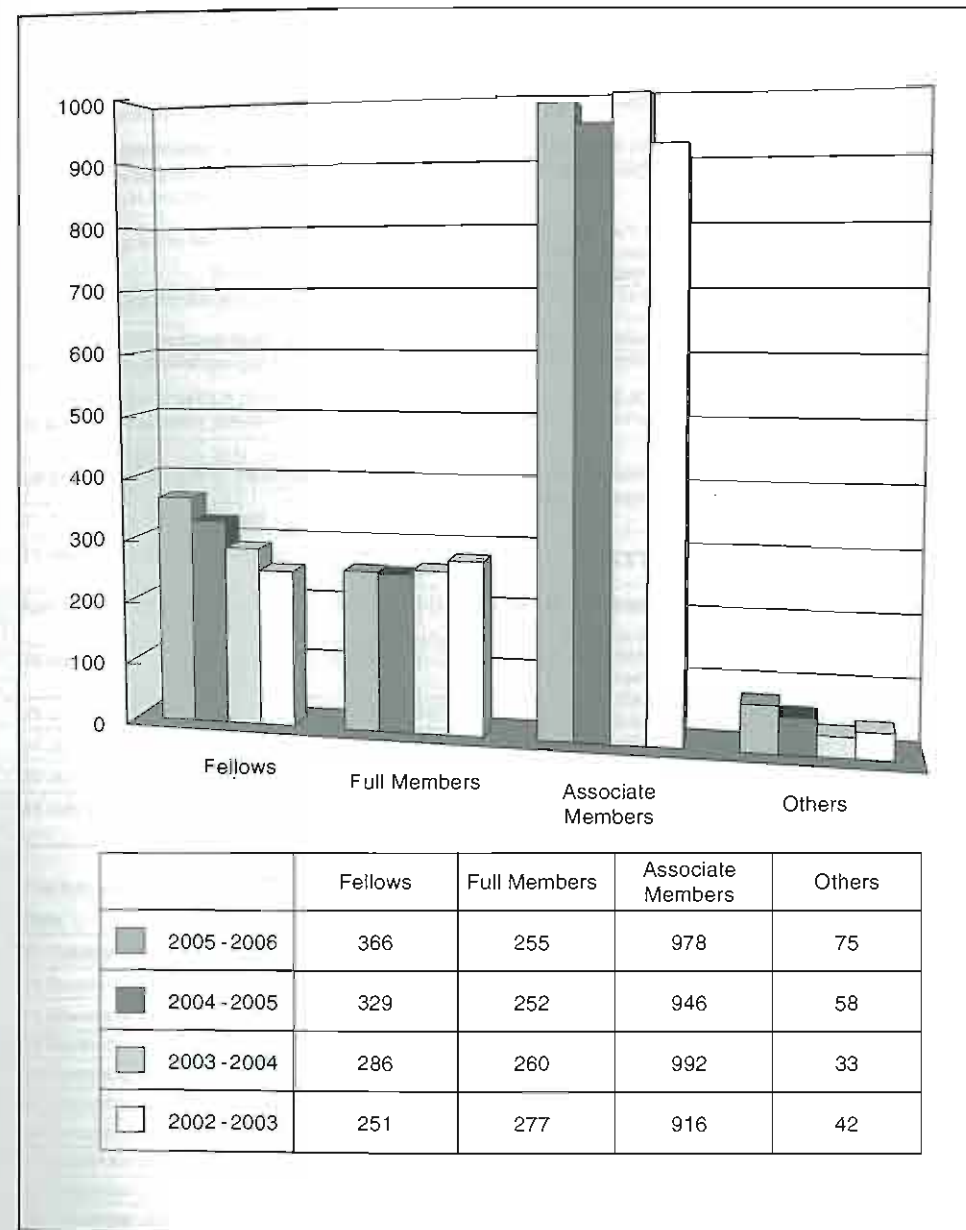

QA & A committee continues to provide our members with different types of CPD activities. At present, most fellows obtained their CPD points only from limited types of CPD activities. Many programmes had not been fully utilized by our members. At the same time, the committee is going to rewrite the Practice Assessment Package (PAP), which was compiled with the original practice assessment segment of our Exit Examination, formulated in 1996. Infectious disease control and risk management would be incorporated. Fellows and members from different public and private sectors will be invited to join the working group. It is worthwhile to note that HKAM proposed amendment of the HKAM fellow CME requirement in 2011 when all HKAM fellows will be required to participate in active learning and CPD activities.

In 2005, over 80% of the college fellows fulfilled the QA requirements. The statistics were as follows:

Following the release of the consultative document "Building a Healthy Tomorrow" by the Health and Medical Development Advisory Committee of the Health, Food and Welfare Bureau of the government in July 2005, in which the concept of family medicine and family doctors are placed in a central position in an initiative to revamp the primary healthcare services of Hong Kong, the Research Committee conducted the study 'What Primary Care Services does the Public Want?' to obtain an up to date picture of the community's perception of primary healthcare and its expectations of the services. The winning project for the Annual Research Award 2005 was "Epidemiologic Study of Diabetic Retinopathy in a Primary Care Setting in Hong Kong" by Dr. Tammy K. W. Tam, Mr. Lau Cheuk Man, Dr. Luke C. Y. Tsang, Dr. Ng Kwok Keung, Dr. Ho Kin Sang & Dr. Lai Tat Chau.

The 2006 HKCFP Research Fellowship have received three applications this year, all of good quality. The selection panel has selected the winner to be Dr. Hong Tin Chak. His research project is "Barriers for Primary Care Physicians in providing Palliative Care Service in Hong Kong".

Finally, I wish to thank all who have provided assistance to the Research Committee and look forward to closer collaborations in the future.

The financial situation of our College remains stable for the year 2005-2006. We now have over 17 m in reserve.

In 2005, our College kept over 3.7 m guaranteed fund in the accounts of HSBC; US\$200,000 Bonds deposit, over HK\$1 m time deposit in the accounts of Bank of East Asia; and over HK\$1 m time deposit in the accounts of Wing Hang Bank Ltd.

Our income in 2005 (HK\$9.3 m) showed an increase of 11.9% compared to the previous year. Our income saw an increase of 8% from the Board of Education (HK\$1 m), 22.4% from the Board of DFM (HK\$2 m), 13.7% from the Board of Conjoint Examination (HK\$1.9 m), 29.7% from the Specialty Board (HK\$0.38 m), 78.6% from the Finance Committee (HK\$0.7 m) and slightly over 2.3% from the Membership Committee (HK\$1.4 m) compared to the year in 2004. On the other hand, income from the Board of Vocational Training and Standards (HK\$1 m) was slightly decreased by 0.2%, and the Editorial Board (HK\$0.4 m) income decreased by 21% lesser compared to the year of 2004.

Our total expenditure in 2005, (HK\$7.7 m), was 14.1% higher than that in 2004. Our total sponsorships last year, including RACGP Conference in Darwin, Australia (HK\$10,624), Best Candidate Award in the Conjoint Examination (HK\$20,000), and Family Medicine Prizes to HKU (HK\$10,000) and CUHK (HK\$10,000), amount to about HK\$50,000, 66.8% lesser than in 2004. The two extra expenditure items last year, namely, Train-the-trainer course – Part II & III (HK\$0.39 m), and WONCA HOC 2009 (HK\$2,272), amount to HK\$0.39 m, equivalent to 5.6% of our total expenditure. The expenditure to maintain our College secretariat (HK\$3.4 m), to pay for our various College functions (HK\$0.16 m), and management fees (HK\$0.17 m), remain substantial (HK\$3.7 m), being 32.4% greater than that in 2004.

Our total operating surplus in 2005 was HK\$1.5 m, with an increase of HK\$20,000 (over 1.9%) as compared to 2004.

I would like to thank Ms. Fiona Ho, our Administrative Executive, for her hard work in taking care of our accounts.


Basis of opinion

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 LEGAL STATUS

The College is a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The liability of each of its members, in the event of its being wound up while he is a member, or within one year after he ceased to be a member for payment of the debts and liabilities of the College contracted before he ceases to be a member, and costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves, is limited to an amount not exceeding HK\$10.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Expenditure incurred after the assets have been put into operation, such as repairs and maintenance costs, is normally charged to the income statement in the period in which it is incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of the asset, the expenditure is capitalised as an additional cost of the asset.

The gain or loss on disposal or retirement of an asset recognised in the income statement is the difference between the sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the relevant asset.

Depreciation is calculated on the straight line method at the following rates to write off the costs of the assets over their estimated useful lives.

Furniture, fixtures and equipment 15% p.a.

(b) Related company

A related company is a company in which one or more of the directors of the company have a beneficial interest or is in a position to exercise significant influence over the company.

(c) Revenue recognition

Entrance fees from members are recognised in the financial year of receipt.

Annual subscription fee is recognised on a time proportion basis.

Interest income is recognised on the time proportion basis taking into account the principal outstanding and the effective rate of interest applicable.

(d) Foreign currencies

Transaction in foreign currencies are translated at exchange rates ruling at the transaction dates. Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies at the year end are translated at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All exchange differences are dealt with in the income statement.

(e) Taxation

Income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax.

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the income statement because it excludes items of income and expense that are taxable or deductible in other years, and it further excludes income statement items that are never taxable and deductible.

Deferred tax is the tax expected to be payable or recoverable on differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit, and is accounted for using the balance sheet liability method. Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable temporary differences, and deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that taxable profits will be available against which deductible temporary differences can be utilised. Such assets and liabilities are not recognised if the temporary difference arises from goodwill (or negative goodwill) or from the initial recognition (other than in a business combination) of other assets and liabilities in a transaction that affects neither the tax profit nor the accounting profit.

Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the liability is settled or the asset realised. Deferred tax is charged or credited in the income statement, except when it relates to items charged or credited directly to equity, in which case the deferred tax is also dealt with in equity.

3 TAXATION

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. LEGAL STATUS

The Foundation is a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The liability of each of its members, in the event of its being wound up while he is a member or within one year after he ceased to be a member for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Foundation contracted before he ceases to be a member, and costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves, is limited to an amount not exceeding HK\$50.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Available-for-sale investments

Available-for-sale investments are non-derivative financial assets in listed equity and debt securities that are designated as available for sale. After initial recognition, available-for-sale investments are measured at fair value, with gains or losses recognised as a separate component of equity until the investment is derecognized or until the investment is determined to be impaired, at which time the cumulative gain or loss previously reported in equity is included in the income statement.

(b) Related company

A related company is a company in which one or more of the directors of the company have a beneficial interest or is in a position to exercise significant influence over the company.

(c) Revenue recognition

Donation received is recognised on receipt basis.

Interest income is recognised on the time proportion basis taking into account the principal outstanding and the effective rate of interest applicable.

(d) Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at exchange rates ruling at the transaction dates. Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies at the year end are translated at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All exchange differences are dealt with in the income statement.

3. TAXATION

No provision for Hong Kong profits tax has been made in the financial statements as the Foundation is exempt from tax under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

4. EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBERS' REMUNERATION

None of the Executive Board members received any remuneration for their services rendered to the Foundation during the year. (2005:Nil)





NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Expenditure incurred after the assets have been put into operation, such as repairs and maintenance costs, is normally charged to the income statement in the period in which it is incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of the asset, the expenditure is capitalised as an additional cost of the asset.

The gain or loss on disposal or retirement of an asset recognised in the income statement is the difference between the sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the relevant asset.

Depreciation is calculated on the straight line basis at the following rates to write off the costs of the assets over their estimated useful lives:

Furniture, fixture and equipment	15% p.a.
Leasehold improvement	15% p.a.

(b) Turnover

Turnover represents course fees received.

(c) Revenue recognition

Revenue arising from professional courses is recognised when received.

Interest income is recognised on the time proportion basis taking into account the principal outstanding and the effective rate of interest applicable.

(d) Taxation

Income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax.

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the income statement because it excludes items of income and expense that are taxable or deductible in other years, and it further excludes income statement items that are never taxable and deductible.

Deferred tax is the tax expected to be payable or recoverable on differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit, and is accounted for using the balance sheet liability method. Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable temporary differences, and deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that taxable profits will be available against which deductible temporary differences can be utilised. Such assets and liabilities are not recognised if the temporary difference arises from goodwill (or negative goodwill) or from the initial recognition (other than in a business combination) of other assets and liabilities in a transaction that affects neither the tax profit nor the accounting profit.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at each balance sheet date and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the liability is settled or the asset realised. Deferred tax is charged or credited in the income statement, except when it relates to items charged or credited directly to equity, in which case the deferred tax is also dealt with in equity.

2. TAXATION

Provision for Hong Kong profits tax has been made in the financial statements at 17.5% (2005:Nil) of the estimated assessable profits for the year.
