



Case Demonstration

The Information Seminar on OSCE segment was held on 16 June 2019. A total of 18 candidates (Cat I: 16, Cat II: 2) and members from the Board – including the Chairman, the OSCE Coordinator, the Deputy OSCE Coordinator and the secretarial staff attended the seminar.

The seminar started with a warm welcome by our Chairman, Dr. Chan Hung Chiu, who first introduced the concept and expectations of our Conjoint Examination. He then explained the various measures undertaken by the Board to ensure the examination is fair, reliable and valid to all the candidates.

Dr. Chui Siu Hang Billy (OSCE Coordinator) presented information related to the examination. One candidate was invited on spot to participate in an 8-minute sample case and Dr. Chui assisted in the role-playing scenario.

We presented the marking scheme and went through the setting of the domains of each case. We also explained the marking rationale behind using essential marking points to divide between pass and fail for a particular domain in each question. The candidates were given a chance to mark the scenario with the respective key feature checklist themselves and understand how to assess a particular domain and how to achieve the pass criteria in each domain.

Dr. Tsang Pui Lim, the winner of the Dr. Peter C. Y. Lee Best Candidate Award in last year's Conjoint Examination, was also invited to share his personal experience with the candidates.

This year the Board again plan to invite the candidates to participate in the rehearsal day on the 6 October 2019. They will get a chance to role play as candidates and meet with the examiners. Their response is positive.

On the whole the atmosphere was friendly and the candidates were enthusiastic. Feedback forms were distributed and their feedback was positive. Looking at the feedback statistics, most candidates benefited from this seminar and found it very useful. The majority of attendees agreed that the seminar helped their OSCE preparation, and provided useful information regarding how their performance will be assessed.

In summary, the afternoon was fruitful for both the candidates and board members. It is hoped that the additional information provided to the candidates will help translate their hard work into success in the coming examination!





I had enjoyed some very nice French cuisine with other young doctors at the Gala dinner.



POCUS/FAMUS: A Powerful Tool To Augment Physical Examination In General Practice

Introduction

Use of POCUS (Point Of Care Ultrasound) by family physician or FAMUS – Family Medicine Ultrasound, is becoming more popular. It is an effective, powerful tool for clinical assessment enabling a clinician to make more timely and accurate diagnosis. FAMUS is most commonly performed in assessment involving abdominal organs, head and neck region, vascular and musculoskeletal systems. The following cases encountered in the general outpatient setting in public sector illustrate its value in our daily practice.

Case 1

A 52 year-old man attended the casualty department for constipation in October 2018. An abdominal X-ray was taken, which showed opacity over the left psoas shadow between L3-L4 level. The diagnosis of ureteric stone was suspected. (Fig 1)



He was then referred to the urology specialist outpatient clinic and was seen in March 2019. A non-contrast CT scan was booked by the urologist, with the appointment in February 2020.

On 2/4/2019, he came to the general outpatient evening clinic for follow up of hypertension. He was found to have significant deterioration in renal function with eGFR having dropped from 76 to 47 ml/min/1.73m² in his routine annual blood test. In view of the possibility of the presence of ureteric stone as suggested by his previous X-ray taken in the casualty department, obstructive nephropathy resulting in deteriorated renal function was highly suspected. Bedside ultrasound was thus performed and moderate left kidney hydronephrosis with hydroureter was detected (Fig 2).

The clinical diagnosis of left ureteric stone with obstructive nephropathy was made. He was referred back to the urologist for urgent management to avoid risking further renal damage.

Take home message:

Dilated renal pelvis and ureter is the typical feature of hydronephrosis in ultrasound examination. Although non-contrast CT scan (NCCT) is the most sensitive investigation for urinary tract stone, the long waiting time is its downside in public sector. POCUS performed by clinician instead would be a valuable tool for evaluation. Urgent relief of the obstruction in obstructive nephropathy can save the kidney and reverse the renal function.


Case 2

A 38 year-old man who had history of nasopharyngeal cancer (NPC), with chemo-radiotherapy completed in 2018, presented with a right upper cervical swelling that had increased in size to 3cm in diameter. He was suspected to have lymph node metastasis from NPC by the oncologist. FNAC was performed, which revealed the unexpected diagnosis of thyroid papillary carcinoma. He was referred to the Head and Neck Surgery team for further management. Meanwhile he was also referred and triaged to the Family Medicine Specialist Clinic (FMSC) for the neck swelling while waiting for the Head and Neck Surgery assessment. A Bed side ultrasound was performed which showed a mid-cervical matted lymph node with mixed echogenicity, micro-calcification and cystic degeneration (Fig 3). The lymph node had lost the normal architecture and the colour Doppler showed increase vascularity (Fig 4). The findings were suggestive of lymph node metastasis with cystic degeneration secondary to rapid growth.

POCUS on the thyroid was also performed, which showed a 1cm hypoechoic lesion with micro-calcification and an irregular border over the right lobe of thyroid (Fig 5). Colour Doppler showed increased chaotic vascularity (Fig 6).

Together with the FNAC result, it could be concluded that the patient was having a second primary papillary carcinoma of thyroid with lymph node metastasis, and it was possibly a result or complication of radiotherapy for his NPC.

Take home message:

Papillary carcinoma of thyroid has typical ultrasound features of hypoechogenicity, irregular border, punctate micro-calcification and increased chaotic vascularity. POCUS is useful to locate the origin of the primary malignancy if there is cervical lymph node metastasis.

Case 3

A 70 year-old gentleman presented in our family medicine specialist clinic (FMSC) with an incidental finding of increased opacity over the right upper quadrant of the abdomen in a chest X-ray. POCUS on upper abdomen was performed which showed calcification of the gall bladder wall with posterior acoustic shadow, suggestive of porcelain gall bladder. (Fig 7)




Although the patient had no symptoms, in view of the risk of future malignant conversion he was referred to the surgery specialist outpatient clinic for consideration of elective cholecystectomy.

Take home message:

The main difference between the ultrasound finding of a porcelain gall bladder and gallstone is the WES sign (Wall-Echo-Shadow sign: the hyperechoic gallstone always lies between the wall and the post-acoustic shadow) (Fig 8) which is absent in the porcelain gall bladder. It is crucial to differentiate between the two conditions because the management would be different. For gallstones we can consider conservative approach if the patient is asymptomatic. However, for porcelain gall bladder prophylactic cholecystectomy would be the choice of management as the risk of future malignant conversion can be up to 22%.

Summary:

POCUS by family physician is effective in achieving a more timely and accurate diagnosis. Early detection of urgent or malignant condition in the first doctor-patient encounter in general practice can make a huge difference in averting the disease course of these serious conditions. It can be performed effectively by the clinician even in a busy general outpatient evening clinic.
