



Dear College Members,

RE: MCHK CME Programme for Practicing Doctors who are not taking CME Programme for Specialists (Ver. Oct 2025)

For College members who are new registrants **or** those who would like to switch their MCHK CME Administrator to Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) via College (with current cycle start date 1 January only) **starting from 1 st January 2026**, they must submit Registration Consent Form to College Secretariat before **22 December 2025 (Monday)**, and the processing of MCHK CME record will be facilitated accordingly.

Interested members who are currently not registered with HKAM should note the following:

- 1. MCHK registrants will have to liaise with their current CME Administrator (HKMA, DU, DH) for the necessary procedures in relation to change of the CME Administrator.
- 2. Change of CME Administrator from 'other CME Administrator' to 'HKAM via HKCFP' can be arranged after **ONE Cycle Year of programme has completed**, given that HKAM was not the administrator of your previous MCHK CME

 Cycle.
- 3. Retrospective submission cannot be accredited outside the said time frame. In case of any discrepancy of accredited CME Points between HKCFP and 'other Administrators', the HKCFP has the final decision on the final accredited CME Points.

As our College is required to report the CME Points to HKAM every 6 months, MCHK CME registrants **MUST** sign on the respective MCHK CME attendance record sheet for CME record purposes. **To help the College Secretariat to distinguish College members from others, please identify yourself by entering your HKCFP membership number or simply putting "HKCFP" in the column of HKAM. MCHK CME record may not be updated if one fails to update MCHK CME Administrator in a timely fashion.**

The above arrangement is for our College members only. The required Registration Consent Form can be downloaded at www.hkcfp.org.hk > Downloads > 'Quality Assurance & Accreditation'. Please return the completed form to our College Secretariat at cmecpd@hkcfp.org.hk before the aforementioned deadline to facilitate the necessary arrangement. Dear Members,

Members of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners, who live and work in Hong Kong and fulfill HKCFP CME & CPD requirements, may enroll with the RACGP QI&CPD Program by reciprocal recognition between the two programs and be deemed to fulfill their minimum requirements. Please refer to below link for the RACGP Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Program for 2023-25 triennium:

Participants of the HKCFP Quality Assurance Program who have obtained at least 30 credit points, with no less than 10 CPD points **in year 2025**, may enroll with the RACGP CPD Program through this reciprocal arrangement and be deemed to fulfill their minimum requirements of the same year.

Please noted that as required by RACGP, doctors are required to take at least one CPR course in order to meet all the RACGP CPD requirements for the 2023 – 2025 triennium. You can refer to the below link for RACGP requirements for CPR Courses:

RACGP also has the final authority of deciding whether their QI&CPD requirements are fulfilled.

CME/CPD Compliance 2023-25 Cycle

Dear Colleagues,

As cycle 2023-2025 is going to be finalized, please kindly check your updated report by visiting the College website at https://www.hkcfp.org.hk/cme_mchkcme_report.aspx (Membership login is required)

The committee wishes to highlight that all fellows and members of HKCFP must engage in ALL categories of activities in order to fulfill the **QA Certificate 2023-2025** criteria, briefly summarized as follows:

- (1) A minimum of 90 points in total, including at least 30 CPD points
- (2) A maximum of 45 credit points will be counted for each category of educational activities
- (3) Participants must engage in **ALL** categories of activities
- (4) Maximum points set for Subcategories (3.01, 3.02, 3.03a-c, 3.04, 3.09, 3.10)

For Point (2) and (3) above, the 'categories' are referring to

- i) Category 3, related to CPD activities,
- ii) Category 4, related to activities organized by our College alone, and
- iii) Category 5, related to pre-accredited activities organized by other professional institutions themselves or in collaboration with our College. Examples of this category include accredited educational events by the Hong Kong Medical Association, The Universities, the Hospital Authority, and the Primary Care Office / Department of Health.

To obtain CME Certificate 2025, Members should obtain at least 30 Credit Points in either CME or CPD or both.

In particular, **HKAM Fellows** are required to obtain the minimum of 90 points, including **at least 15 CPD points** in a 3-year cycle (2023-2025).

For Reciprocal Recognition for year **2025**, members should obtain at least 30 Credit Points with no less than 10 CPD points in year 2025.

Please be reminded that **ONLY CPD points** would be accredited for teaching medical students in Universities.

The log is required to be submitted within one month after the Lecture.

Journal:

Specific articles published in the HK Practitioner or HK Medical Journal

HK Practitioner: Update Article, Original Article, Discussion Paper, Internet

HK Medical Journal: Original Article, Review Article, Medical Practice

('Online First' articles are not included)

The log is required to be submitted within one month after publication.

Late submission of CPD logs would not be accepted. Please be reminded you must fulfill the requirement to obtain CME points, in order to obtain CPD points through activity CPD Log.

Requirements to obtain HKCFP CME for attending online CME events:

- 1) Attend 75% or above of the length of the online session;
- 2) To complete a post event quiz*, questionnaire OR feedback form set by organizer (* MCQ/ True or False Question; 50% or above correct answers are required.)

Hong Kong is Ready to Say NO to Smoking

Hong Kong's New Anti-Smoking Law: A Turning Point in Tobacco Control

The recent passage of the 2025 Anti-Smoking (Amendment) Bill marks a significant milestone in Hong Kong's ongoing commitment to reducing tobacco use and protecting public health. Dubbed the "Ten New Tobacco Control Measures" (控煙十招), this updated legislation advocates a multifaced approach to combating smoking — integrating stronger restrictions, expanding smoke-free zones, banning flavoured tobacco products, and tightening enforcement against illicit cigarettes.

Let us review the newly passed measures, evaluate them in the context of Hong Kong's broader tobacco control history and cessation trends, and compare the territory's approach with other Asian regions such as Singapore, South Korea, Macau, Japan, and mainland China. That helps our future planning on public health and policy-making.

A Retrospective Review on Past Government Measures:

Hong Kong has consistently put a lot of effort on tobacco control:

- **1982** Introduction of the Smoking (Public Health) Ordinance, banning tobacco advertising on television and radio.
- **1990s** Incremental advertising restrictions, expansion of smoke-free indoor spaces, and introduction of public tobacco education campaigns.
- **2007–2009** Comprehensive ban on indoor smoking in restaurants, workplaces, and other public areas; mandatory pictorial health warnings.
- **2011** The duty for tobacco products was increased by 41.46%.
- **2016** Graphic warnings expanded to cover 85% of cigarette packaging.
- **2022** Ban on alternative smoking products (e-cigarettes, heated tobacco devices) imports and sales, though possession for personal use was initially allowed.
- **2025** The current "Ten New Tobacco Control Measures" solidify Hong Kong's leadership in aggressive tobacco regulation.

Key Measures in the 2025 Tobacco Control Amendment - Hong Kong's Ten Anti-Smoking Moves (控煙十招)

The "Ten Moves" form a comprehensive strategy to further lower smoking rates and protect public health. Key provisions include:

- Mandatory duty-paid cigarette stamp system to combat illicit tobacco.
- Ban on smoking while queuing for public transport or entering key sites such as hospitals and parks.
- **Expansion of statutory smoke-free areas** to more public facilities—including daycare centers and nursing homes.
- Ban on all flavoured cigarettes (including menthol), heated tobacco, and e-cigarettes, strengthening prior restrictions by prohibiting even personal possession.
- Harsher penalties for illicit tobacco possession and trade—fines doubled to HK\$2 million, with up to seven years' imprisonment.
- Enhanced powers and resources for tobacco control officers, including search authority in enforcement.
- Tougher bans on sales to minors
- · Increased publicity and education around quitting
- **Phased implementation:** Certain measures, such as the menthol ban, will follow a staged rollout.
- Regulations for clear signage and border guidance to reduce confusion and support tourism.

This package enjoys broad legislative and public support, with majority of lawmakers in favour with minimal opposition. According to Secretary for Health Prof Chung-mau LO, this legislative package is rooted in scientific evidence and public consensus, with the primary goal of safeguarding the next generation. He noted that "a smoke-free Hong Kong" is the prevailing societal aspiration, framing tobacco control as a must-answer question rather than a policy choice.

Hong Kong's Smoking Cessation Targets

Hong Kong has long maintained some of the lowest smoking prevalence rates globally. As of 2023, daily cigarette smoking prevalence hovered around **9.1%** of the population — markedly lower than many industrialized economies. The government's stated objective, updated in its 2024 policy address, is to **reduce the rate to 7.8% or below by 2025** and aim closer to **5% by the early 2030s**.

These targets align with the World Health Organization's (WHO) vision of a tobacco endgame, often defined as fewer than 5% of the population smoking. Achieving this will require continued legislative innovation, persistent public health advocacy, and robust cessation support systems.

Progress and Challenges in Trends of Smoking Cessation

Over the past decades, Hong Kong has experienced a steady decline in smoking prevalence. In the 1980s, daily

smoking rates exceeded 23%; by the early 2000s the figure dipped below 15%, and by the 2020s stabilized around 10%. Several factors contributed to this decline:

- Aggressive taxation on tobacco products.
- Pioneering adoption of pictorial health warnings (first implemented in 2007).
- Comprehensive smoke-free legislation enacted in 2007–2009 banning smoking in restaurants, workplaces, and many public areas.
- Continuous media campaigns highlighting tobacco harms and promoting cessation services.
- Community-based outreach programmes targeting vulnerable groups such as ethnic minorities, lowincome workers, and youth.

Despite this progress, several challenges persist. Social acceptability of smoking among certain age groups, the growth of vaping and heated tobacco products, and the persistence of an illicit cigarette market hinder policy impact. Furthermore, mental health comorbidities and addiction-related relapse contribute to the difficulty of sustained cessation.

Comparing with Other Asian Regions

A regional comparison highlights both Hong Kong's strengths and areas where other jurisdictions have experimented with different approaches.

Region	Daily Smoking Prevalence	Key Measures
Hong Kong	~9% (2023)	High tobacco tax, wide smoke- free zones, ban on flavoured cigarettes, e-cigarette restrictions
Singapore	~11% (2022)	Progressive age-based ban - to raise purchase age 21, plain packaging, high taxes
South Korea	~18–20%	Large graphic warnings, high taxes, smoke-free zones; weaker restrictions on flavoured cigarettes

The Road to a Smoke-Free Hong Kong

The passage of the 2025 anti-smoking amendment signals a renewed political will to move toward a tobacco endgame. Still, realising a **<5% smoking prevalence by early 2030s** will demand:

- Timely implementation of second-phase measures, including the menthol ban.
- Strengthened border enforcement against illicit tobacco trade.
- Expansion of cessation services, especially leveraging digital health tools.
- Sustained public education campaigns that highlight not just harm, but the benefits of quitting.
- Regular policy review to adapt to emerging products and marketing tactics..

Endgame-style tobacco control is not a static project but an evolving strategy — requiring vigilance, consensus-building, and the political courage to prioritize health over commercial interests.

健康人生計劃一婦女健康服務及三高篩檢服務

陳佩瑩女士(港島西醫院聯網家庭醫學及基層醫療部資深護師)

服務背景

政府的《基層醫療健康藍圖》提出改革措施加強以預防為重的基層醫療健康服務,包括「慢性疾病共同治理先導計劃」,透過「一人一家庭醫生」和由地區康健中心或地區康健站(地區康健中心/站)統籌的跨專業公私營協作模式,資助市民在私營醫療界別接受預防篩查和管理「三高」(即高血壓、高血糖和高血脂)。

為低收入家庭和弱勢社群提供 的預防篩查及護理服務

為照顧弱勢社群的健康服務需要,政府在全港各區,例如以中西區及南區為例,西營盤及鴨脷洲家庭醫學診所成為政府選定的診所,以新服務模式試行,並為弱勢社群提供預防篩查及護理服務,達致「早預防、早發現、早治療」的目標。符合資格的人士(包括綜合社會保障援助受助人、75歲或と的人士(包括綜合社會保障援助受助人、75歲或と問書人士)可透過地區康健中心站,安排到選定的家庭醫學診所接受預防性婦女保健及健康促進服務,旨在促進及早發現和治療慢性疾病,鼓勵參加者自我健康管理,從而幫助他們更有效管理慢性疾病,促進健康及預防併發症。

婦女健康服務

基層醫療署已在今年二月制定並推出《香港基層醫療健康人生計劃參考概覽之婦女篇》,以持續提升基層醫療服務的水平。該參考概覽為基層醫療服務提供者訂立清晰指引,提倡以實證為本的預防性護理,協助婦女及早識別和處理在不同人生階段可能出現的健康問題,促進婦女自我管理健康能力。

醫管局家庭醫學診所為聚焦 照顧弱勢社群,新增預防 28日開始,診所透過地合為 健中心/站的轉介,為符上區 格的女性(包括64歲以人 格的女性(包括64歲以人或 會保障援助受助人提供 醫療費用減免人士),提供進 務。



診所會以「健康人生計劃」為本,按不同的健康需要提供合適的預防篩查及護理服務,以預防或及早診斷疾病及減少相關併發症,服務包括:

- 三高血液化驗檢查
- 子宮頸抹片檢查
- 乳房造影檢查(需經評估)
- 婦女健康教育
- 醫生健康評估





三高篩檢服務

此外,各區選定的家庭醫學診所亦為合資格的45歲以上人士提供三高篩檢服務(即高血壓、高血糖和高血脂),透過詳細評估,提供抽血服務及血壓監測,按參加者的健康狀況,就服務範疇訂定健康管理方案,包括預防篩查及護理、健康教育和諮詢等,以控制慢性疾病風險因素促進健康,加強服務對象的健康意識。

無敵「千本鳥居」 沙境高山稻荷神社

提起「千本鳥居」,最為有名的是日本京都的伏見稻荷大 社,深受外國遊客的歡迎,結果總是去到遇上人擠人,似 乎世界上只有那裡有千本鳥居似的。今天我們特別來到一 個較少被香港人所認識的景點,讓你來一睹為快,那就是 青森縣津輕市的高山稻荷神社。

首先,讓我們來講講這個景點的一些歷史背景。相傳高山 稻荷神社的創建者是鐮倉時代至室町時代統治津輕地區的 豪門望族安藤氏。神社內供奉著保佑五穀豐登、出海平安 和生意興隆的神明,在當地頗受推崇。不過,因為神社位 於面朝日本海的七里長濱附近的一處高地上,曾經從JR五 所川原站驅車也約需30分鐘,所以之前來此觀光的遊客並 不多。



稻荷神的形象被描繪成白色狐狸。因此稻荷神社都 會設置一些小狐狸雕像,作為神社的守護者。

2016年,北海道新幹線的新青森站至新函館北斗站區間段正式通車。千本鳥居作為青森縣知名景點刊登在 日本鐵路公司的宣傳海報上,從而引起了人們的關注,前來參拜的遊客急劇增加。遊客將拍攝的圖片上傳 上網,名聲遠傳海外。





「千本鳥居」的歷 史其實只有40年 左右。起初,當地 農戶捐獻了幾座鳥 居,後來越來越多 的人表示想捐獻鳥 居。不過,神社境 內分佈著水池,鳥 居難以筆直排列。 因境內建有一座 「龍神宮」,所以 想到「索性排列 成蜿蜒的遊龍一 般」,於是打造出 了呈優美曲線排列 的千本鳥居。一口 氣穿過一系列朱紅 色的「千本鳥居」 感覺其實很美妙, 好像坐過山車一樣 刺激。

POCUS workshops



Several seminars and workshops at the conference focused on Point-of-Care Ultrasound (POCUS), providing valuable opportunities for hands-on learning. The sessions covered a wide range of topics, including abdominal scanning, assessment of lumps and bumps, evaluation of dyspnoea, thyroid nodules, and common musculoskeletal conditions. Through these workshops, we gained practical knowledge and basic skills in applying POCUS. One particularly insightful seminar, "Refining POCUS Education: Building Consensus and Standardization in Family Medicine Residencies in the USA," shared their plans to develop a structured POCUS curriculum and reliable assessment tools for evaluating POCUS proficiency in the USA. These sessions inspired us to explore how POCUS can be integrated into daily practice in primary care, particularly in triaging patients with acute symptoms, such as abdominal pain or shortness of breath, to help identify those who require urgent referral and timely specialist management.




Al vs human touch

Several lectures at the conference highlighted how advancing technology and artificial intelligence (AI) are reshaping the landscape of family medicine. A key message emerged: Al should never replace the human connection at the core of care, but instead help strengthen it. By managing routine tasks and improving efficiency, AI can free up valuable time for physicians to do what matters most—listening to and supporting their patients. This message was echoed in Professor Cindy Lam's keynote, "The Human Touch of Primary Care - Art is Long," which underscored the importance of humanity in daily practice. As noted in one of the lectures in the opening ceremony, "The greatest opportunity offered by Al is not reducing errors or workloads, or even curing cancer it's the chance to restore the precious and time-honoured connection and trust- the human touch- between patients and doctors." In a world increasingly driven by technology, the human touch remains irreplaceable.

Global family medicine community

Another highlight of the conference was the opportunity to exchange ideas as part of a truly global family medicine community. One inspiring session was the Lancet Commission on Transformation of Primary Health Care in the Post-COVID Era, chaired by Professor William Wong. The symposium brought together 45 participants from 20 countries across six continents. Participants were divided into six focused discussion groups, each exploring a critical aspect of primary health care transformation: (1) equity of access to healthcare services, (2) patient-centred care, (3) responsible adoption of digital health innovations, (4) medico-social integration, (5) healthcare workforce reform, and (6) responses to future health emergencies. The insights shared will contribute to the ongoing work of the Lancet Commission.

We also attended the "Progress of Family Medicine in the WONCA Asia Pacific Region" workshop, which provided an excellent update on the region's latest developments in family medicine education, research, and policy. It was particularly exciting to promote the upcoming WONCA Asia Pacific Region Conference 2027, which will be hosted in Hong Kong. The session not only strengthened connections amongst regional colleagues but also sparked enthusiasm and collaboration as we welcomed the global family medicine community to gather in Hong Kong for this future event.

These motivational interviewing skills are particularly valuable in primary care, especially when supporting patients managing chronic diseases or addressing lifestyle habits such as smoking and alcohol use. We also attended the symposium "Empowering Health: Exercise Prescription and Supplementation," which began with lively dynamic exercises to energize participants. This was followed by an interactive Q&A session that explored common myths and evidence-based truths about health supplements in sports and fitness.

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
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
